Writing Summaries. A summary is a short overview of the main points of a text. The purpose of a summary is to quickly give the reader or listener an idea of what this material is saying. You may find it helpful to create summaries of your own work, but more often, you will create summaries of material by other authors, such as articles, plays, films, lectures, stories, or presentations.

Writing Summaries—The Word on College Reading and Writing

Each college textbook will have an index that lists the topics that are covered in that chapter. At the start of each chapter there will be a summary page. This will list out areas of focus and help clarify what exactly it is that this chapter is about. At the beginning or the end of each chapter or sub section in the textbook, there will be a section listing the learning outcome of this chapter.
